ARTABRO III: Research, innovation and governance for the marine SPABs of the north-eastern Iberian Peninsula

Description and objectives

The project aimed to improve the conservation status of seabirds through three key pillars. The first is to improve knowledge of their population sizes, use of space, threats and conservation status; the second, to facilitate social participation, in particular that of the fishing sector. As the third pillar, to work on the support, promotion, implementation and development of integral and innovative measures to manage the existing marine SPABs

Obtained and/or expected results

The importance of this region has been highlighted for the conservation of black cormorants, being the main breeding ground for the species on the coastline of the Iberian Peninsula.

It has confirmed the establishment of a new Eurasian oyster breeding ground, and it has helped conduct the first complete census of the European storm petrel in Galicia in the 21st century.

It has confirmed the importance of the Cantabrian-Atlantic migratory corridor for dozens of European seabirds and, for the first time, has studied the pre-nuptial migratory route through the marine SPA of the Costa da Morte.

It has increased knowledge of the use of the space by Atlantic Scopoli's shearwater birds resident in Galicia, the most northerly on the planet.
